Step Two: Choose what type of project you are going to do and create your project:

Project Types:

- Artistic Projects
- On-line interactive projects
- Posters
- Videos (please do not include copyrighted music or images)

Step Three: Make your project

The goal of your project is to show that you understand the problem and look at or develop solutions to the problem.

The projects will be evaluated on 5 criteria:

- Project Criteria: Scientific Facts and Bibliography
- Project Criteria: Appearance
- Project Criteria: Spelling and Grammar
- Project Criteria: Creativity
- Project Criteria: Quality as an Educational Tool

After you have completed your project prepare to turn the project by:

- For Posters or Artistic Projects -- take a photo or make a pdf
- For Video or Electronic Files, create a web link
- Name the project: Last name_school_project type
 - o If the project is smaller than 10 MB or a link, you will be able to submit it on the registration form.
