1. Power Sector Carbon Reduction Policies for North Carolina

Description: The presentation will summarize a report on carbon reduction policies for the North Carolina power sector conducted by Duke University's Nicholas Institute for Environmental Policy Solutions and the University of North Carolina's Center for Climate, Energy, Environment, and Economics. The analysis focuses on policies identified in Recommendation A-1 of the North Carolina Clean Energy Plan (CEP). The report reflects extensive modeling, policy and economic analysis, and a year of work with stakeholders representing diverse constituencies in North Carolina. The report evaluates design options and the associated tradeoffs for policymakers but does not make specific recommendations on the path forward.
