## Periodic Review of Existing Rules

- Prior to 2013 rules did not expire
- 150B-21.3A requires 10-year review of most rules
- "Unnecessary" rule is one determined by an agency to obsolete, redundant, or otherwise no longer required
- Unnecessary rules will expire

Initial Determination by Staff	August 27, 2025
CRC Approves Initial Determinations for Public Comment	August or November 2025 CRC meeting
Public Comment Period	Sept - Nov, 2025 <u>or</u> Dec - Jan, 2025
Action to Approve Final Determinations Report	Potentially February 2026
Report due to OAH/RRC	June 20, 2026
Report becomes effective ~61 days or earlier if the JLAPOC meets	Late 2026
