

Septage Management Program



Septage Management Program G.S. 130A-291.1

(a) The Department shall establish and administer a septage management program in accordance with the provisions of this section.

G.S.130A-291.1(b)

For the protection of public health, the Commission shall adopt rules governing the management of septage. including standards for the transportation, storage, treatment, and disposal of septage;

operator registration and training;

 the issuance, suspension, and revocation of permits;

 and procedures for the payment of annual fees.

Septage Management Firm

Means a person engaged in the business of pumping, transporting, storing, treating or disposing of septage. The term does not include public or community wastewater systems that treat or dispose of septage per G.S. 130A-290(33).

G.S. 130A-291.1(c)

 No septage management firm shall commence or continue operation that does not have a permit issued by the Department.

 The permit shall be issued only when the septage management firm satisfies all of the requirements of the rules adopted by the Commission.

What Do We Regulate

SEPTAGE

Definition


 "Septage" means solid waste that is a fluid mixture of untreated and partially treated sewage solids, liquids, and sludge of human or domestic origin which is removed from a wastewater system per G.S. 130A-290(32).

 The term "septage" includes the following

Domestic Septage

Either liquid or solid material removed from a septic tank, cesspool, portable toilet, Type III marine sanitation device, or similar treatment works receiving only domestic sewage per G.S.130A-290(32)a.

Marina Permit Requirements



Who Needs a Permit


 All Marinas either existing or new that discharge directly into an approved sewer system or a permitted septic system with authorization from the permitting authority;

Will not need a permit from us However.... Any Marina either existing or new that use a **Detention** Tank for storage are classified as a Non-Pumpers and will need to obtain a "Non-Pumper" permit from the Division of Waste Management.

Non-Pumpers

 An individual who operates a septage treatment or disposal facility but who does not engage in the business of pumping, transporting, or disposing of septage shall pay an annual fee of two hundred dollars (\$200) per G.S.130A-291.1(e1). This applies to land application site operators or septage detention/treatment facility operators – that do not have firm permits.

 This includes storage tanks at marinas (marina pumpouts) but not boats that serve as pump vehicles.





Annual Nonpumper Fees

- \$200 per SLAS or SDTF permit, per year
- "Non-pumper" application form & appropriate fee due by Dec 31st of each year.

 Permitted septage management firms do not owe any fee for a SLAS or SDTF permit – already paying \$550 or \$800 per year.

Notice & Late Fees per G.S130A-291.1(e2)

 A properly completed application for a permit and the annual fee under this section are due by *1 January* of each year.

 The Department shall mail a notice of the annual fees to each permitted septage management firm and each individual who operates a septage treatment or disposal facility prior to 1 November of each year. This office sends out a reminder by November 1st of each year.

 You shall submit a properly completed firm application & fee by December 31st.



G.S.130A-291.1(e2) continued

A late fee in the amount equal to fifty percent (50%) of the annual permit fee under this section shall be submitted when a properly completed application and annual permit fee are not submitted by 1 January following the 1 November notice.

 We "may" charge the late fee for incomplete applications.

Various mistakes – missing (signatures, checks, application forms, WWTP authorizations) and incomplete information on forms. Need original forms/no copies

 Incomplete/incorrect submittals slow down the permitting process.

G.S. 130A-291.1(e4)

Permits for new septage management firm operators and permits for septage management firm operators that have not operated a septage management firm in the *24 months* immediately proceeding the submittal of an application shall be considered *probationary 12 months*.

The job's not over till the paperwork's done!!!!

Detention Facility Logs

At the present time there are no requirements to maintain a Marina Pump out Log

However Detention Tank Operators must remove waste from the tank every 6 Months
