Comments from the Public

Ms. Lew also commented on the Conflict of interest statement that the Commission addresses at the opening of each meeting. The Wake Stone Triangle Quarry original permit was denied, but the Commission at the time overturned the denial and approved the permit. That past Commission had someone from Wake stone sitting as a member, which seems like a conflict of interest.
