North Carolina County Recycling Program Performance for Fiscal Year 2016-17

The N.C. Division of Environmental Assistance and Customer Service (DEACS) uses data from the Division of Waste Management Consolidated Annual Report completed by each local government in the state to assess the public recycling efforts conducted by municipalities and counties.

Public recycling data for the past several years illustrates that many new recycling programs target non-traditional materials such as asphalt shingles, construction debris, scrap metal, electronics and wood wastes. As these programs have expanded, North Carolina's total annual per capita recycling has increased by 58 pounds over the past decade.

In addition to handling these non-traditional materials, North Carolina municipal and county recycling programs have improved their recovery of common household recyclables or traditional materials, including items like cans, bottles and paper. During FY 2016-17, public recycling systems in North Carolina recycled more common household recyclables than ever before. North Carolina experienced a 5.3 percent increase in traditional recyclables compared to the previous year.

Each year, DEACS uses public recycling program data to produce per-capita recycling rates for counties across the state. This analysis combines municipal and county recycling efforts, and then ranks counties based on program performance. Counties are ranked in two ways: overall recycling rate, and recycling rate for common household materials such as cans, bottles and paper.

The per-capita recovery rate for traditional materials helps to compare the relative effectiveness of residential recycling programs, while total public recovery includes efforts to manage other materials such as concrete, shingles and wood wastes, plus special and hazardous wastes like televisions, used motor oil and used cooking oil. Communities at the top of both lists have strong and well-rounded public recycling systems.
