TO THE BEST OF MY KNOWLEDGE, THE LARGE INCREASE IN HH GARBAGE IS DIRECTLY LINKED TO COVID, WITH PEOPLE BEING HOME AND GENERATING MORE GARBAGE WHILE AT HOME. THE LARGE DECREASE IN RECYCLING IS ALARMING, BUT MAY BE EXPLAINED BY THE BILLING AND ESTIMATING OF THE PREVIOUS CONTRACTOR. PREVIOUSLY, WE WERE BILLED FOR EVERY HOUSEHOLD AT A FLAT RATE FOR RECYCLING. NOW, THE TOWN IS CHARGED AS THE RECYCLE SERVICE IS USED PER CUSTOMER.
