Retired Standard Commercial Fishing License (RSCFL)

What Activities Require This License? The Retired Standard Commercial Fishing License allows individuals 65 or older to harvest and sell fish, shrimp, crabs, shellfish, or any marine species. Non-residents cannot harvest or sell shellfish.

What Is The Purpose of This License? To license and identify commercial fishermen.

Who Issues This License? N.C. Division of Marine Fisheries, License and Statistics Section.

How Much Will This License Cost? \$200 for North Carolina residents, \$260 for non-residents.

What Are My Payment Options for License Application Fees? Check or cash.

If Paying by Check, Who do I Make the Check Payable to and Where Do I Send the Check? If applying in-person for a license at any NCDMF Office, the application and check or cash are submitted at the time of purchase. If renewing a license by mail the applicant must submit the application and check to the NCDMF, License Office, PO Box 769, Morehead City, NC 28557. Please make all checks payable to NCDMF.

How Long Will It Take To Review My Application? No review required for existing license holders and transfers. Applicants who do not hold the license may apply to the eligibility board which may take up to six months for review.

How Long Is My License Valid? All licenses are valid for up to one year and expire on June 30th.

Notes/Comments: Individuals 65 years old or older may elect to obtain the Standard Commercial Fishing License (SCFL) or the Retired Standard Commercial Fishing License (RSCFL). This license (RSCFL) is transferable but not assignable. To harvest shellfish, fishermen must elect endorsements to the SCFL or RSCFL. The shellfish endorsement includes harvest of scallops, clams, conchs, whelks, oysters, and mussels in North Carolina waters. Only individual North Carolina residents are eligible for this endorsement.
