# NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) Stormwater Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Permit

**What Activities Require This Permit**? Direct discharges of stormwater from municipal separate storm sewer systems (MS4s) to surface waters of the state.

- **Direct discharge to surface water:** Any discernible, confined, discrete conveyance such as pipe, ditch, channel, tunnel, conduit, from which stormwater is or may be discharged to surface water
- MS4s in US Census Bureau designated Urbanized Areas or are designated under state rules (15A NCAC 02H .0151)

**What Is the Purpose of This Permit?** To protect surface waters into which MS4 discharges by regulating the MS4 system and activities that discharge into the MS4 system.

- MS4 is regulated by developing and implementing a comprehensive Stormwater Management Plan (SWMP) to address six minimum measures
  - Public Education and Outreach
  - o Public Participation and Involvement
  - o Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE)
  - Construction Site Runoff Controls
  - Post-Construction runoff Controls
  - Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping (PP/GH) for Municipal Operations
- Deemed permitted activities are allowed to discharge into MS4 without a permit, please see references:

- Industrial facilities that have either an individual stormwater permit or have coverage under one of the 20
  Industrial General Permits that cover stormwater discharges associated with industrial activities <a href="https://deq.nc.gov/about/divisions/energy-mineral-and-land-resources/stormwater/stormwater-program/npdes-industrial-program/general-industrial-permits">https://deq.nc.gov/about/divisions/energy-mineral-and-land-resources/stormwater-program/npdes-industrial-program/general-industrial-permits</a> may also be regulated under the MS4 permit if they discharge to the MS4.
- Construction activities that disturb one or more acres of land <a href="https://deq.nc.gov/about/divisions/energy-mineral-and-land-resources/stormwater/stormwater-program/npdes-construction-program">https://deq.nc.gov/about/divisions/energy-mineral-and-land-resources/stormwater/stormwater-program/npdes-construction-program</a> and have coverage under the Construction Stormwater General Permit (NCG01) may also be regulated under the MS4 permit if they discharge to the MS4.

### **How Much Will This Permit Cost?**

New/Annual fee for NPDES MS4 Individual Stormwater Permits: \$1000

**How Long Will It Take To Review My Application?** NPDES stormwater individual permits will take approximately six months from the receipt of a complete application package.

How Long Is My Permit or License or Certificate Valid? Up to five years.

**Notes/Comments:** 30-day public notice period required for all individual NPDES permits and renewals.
