Proposal to City of Raleigh, Solid Waste Services -Focus Groups: Recycling Program for downtown city businesses

Background

The City of Raleigh Solid Waste Services (SWS) launched a Recycling Program for downtown city businesses in 2006 - geared towards "increasing recycling and reuse options" for those businesses "whenever feasible". Whitney & Ridout, Inc. has been in contact with Bianca Bradford, SWS Education Specialist, about contributing to this program. Whitney & Ridout, Inc. has been asked to assist in planning and facilitating two focus group sessions – as a follow up to assess the progress of the Recycling Program for downtown business owners/managers.

Objectives

The Objectives of the proposal for the City of Raleigh Solid Waste Services – Recycling Program are:

- To assess progress and gaps of the current Recycling Program for downtown city businesses
- To provide downtown city business owners and managers an opportunity to offer feedback, as well as have a positive interaction with Solid Waste Services and the City of Raleigh
- To provide two highly interactive, focus group sessions with take-home educational materials for each attendee.

Proposal Overview

Whitney & Ridout, Inc. proposes that <u>Step One</u> of the focus group sessions is to begin this project with a one-hour planning session with Carroll Whitney, Sarah Ridout, Bianca Bradford and other key individuals knowledgeable of the Recycling Program (as determined by Bianca Bradford). Background information and/or current material available about the program will be useful prior to the meeting if possible.

Following this meeting, a detailed agenda will be created for the two sessions including: focus group objectives, time limits, topics and methods of input. Once approved, materials will be developed depending on the needs identified. Materials may include a slide pack, assessment materials and/or handouts for business owners/managers.

<u>Step Two</u>: Carroll Whitney will facilitate two focus group sessions (up to two hours per session) for approximately 15 people in each session. Dates to be determined.

<u>Step Three</u>: Carroll Whitney will provide a debrief meeting with Bianca Bradford and any other individuals knowledgeable of the Recycling Program.

Budget

Planning Session – 1 hour Preparation of focus group sessions and materials – 2 hours Facilitation of two sessions (up to 2 hours each) – 4 hours Debrief – 1 hour **Total = 8 hours (one day) at \$1800**

Note that all materials used during focus group sessions will be printed by the city.
