Question #17 -- The City has 11,522 residential households we service and 466 small businesses. On the commercial side we service 870 commercial businesses.

Question#24 -- The City uses 64-gallon recycling containers for collection services to residential customers.

Question #8 -- The City does not have a multifamily recycling program, however we do service (2) two apartment complexes with individual 64-gallon recycling containers.

Question#45 -- The City does collect televisions but we do not count each television because we collect them in conjunction with computers and microwaves.

Question #47 -- Use cooking oil and paint collections are an estimate for this report.

Question #55 -- The City has a television channel that periodically broadcast informational material about recycling in order to educate the public. the city also does mass mailings to inform residential customers about any changes to collection schedules or collection requirements.

Question #56 -- The informational materials on the television channel is handled by our media specialist people and it would be difficult to determine what the budget is for this service since they normally run these informational spots in conjunction with another promotion.

Question #65 -- The city performs a number of service for both residential and commercial customers. On a number of occasions, it is mor cost effective to do these services together and with a mixture of personnel. Therefore, it is difficult to break out or separate cost.

Municipal Solid Waste includes our residential and commercial services. Recycling Program is free to customers and the Sonoco does not charge a fee for disposal cost. Salary and benefits are included in Municipal solid Waste collection cost, the same is said for yard waste collections as far as the collection cost is concerned.
