Question # 45- Pallets Volume: The reduction in Pallet volume is due to the county being more selective about the types of pallets it accepts into its program. The county had found that shipping boxes coming to them contained a large number of crates rather than pallets and so they removed those items. (Email message from Lenoir County staff (8-16-2018)).

Question # 47- Mercury containing bulbs and lights: The cessation of mercury light collection is directly related to county efforts to promote businesses to recycle these mercury containing products. This has effectively reduced the need for that and the county no longer participates in this program (Email message from Lenoir County staff (8-16-2018)).
