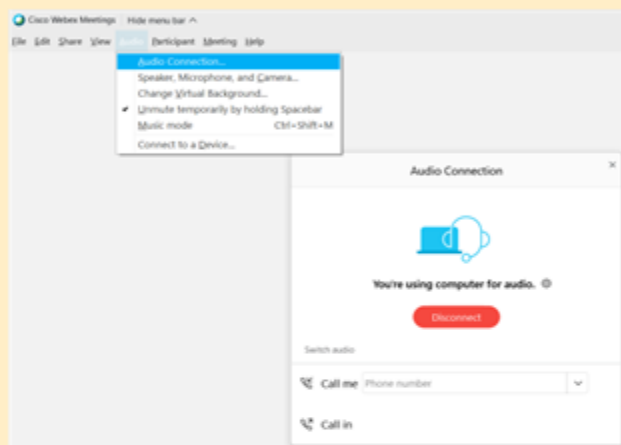

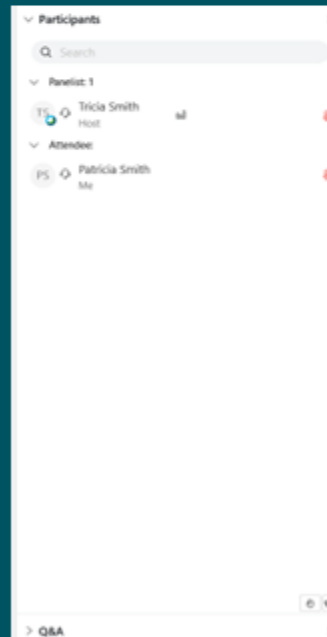


N.C. Division of Marine Fisheries Public Hearing on Proposed Shellfish Leases in Pender County April 15, 2025, at 6 p.m.

To bring up the Participants panel, hover your cursor over the bottom of the page and click on the circular icon with a drawing of a person in it.





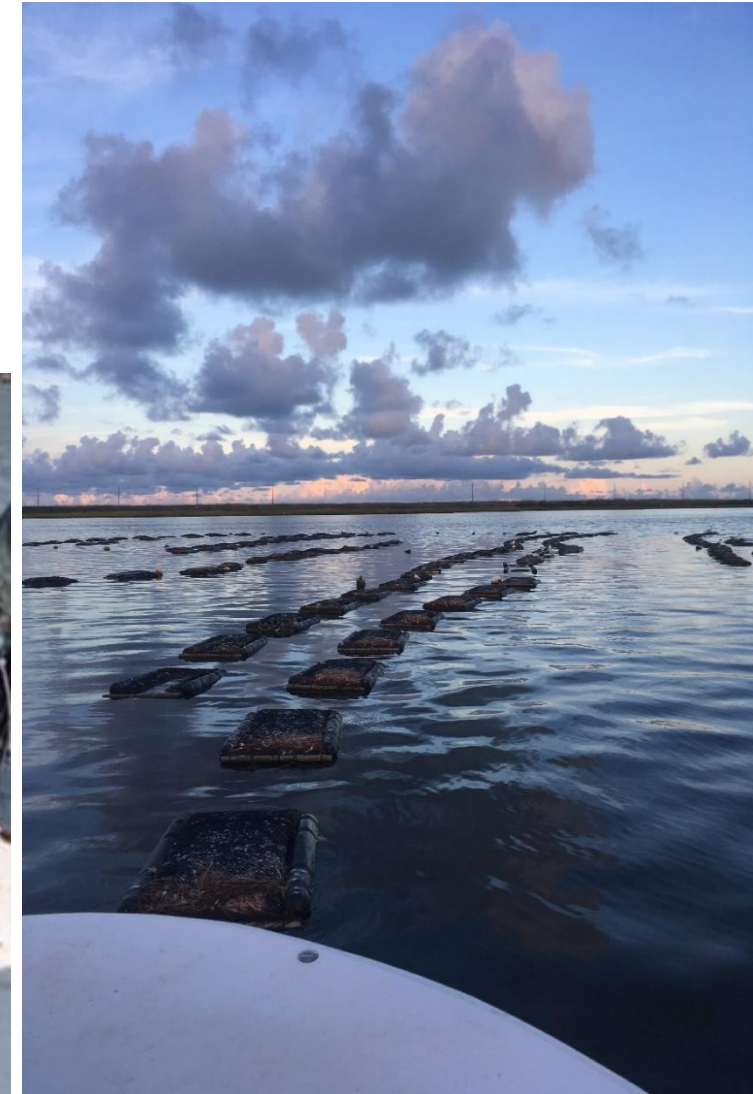
Shellfish Leasing Process

Role of Public Hearing and Public Comment



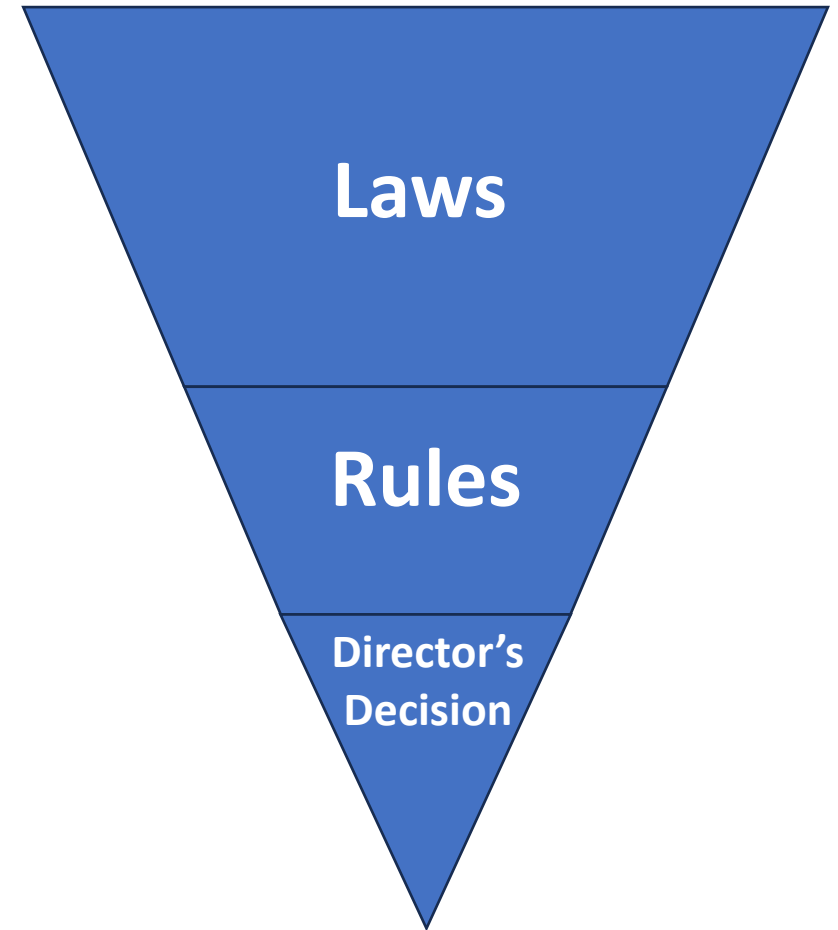
Shellfish Leases Basics

- Public Trust Waters Leased for Shellfish Aquaculture
 - Artificially Propagated Stocks
 - Reared in “Controlled Environment”
 - Leases give private rights to shellfish in an area
 - Water is still navigable at your own risk

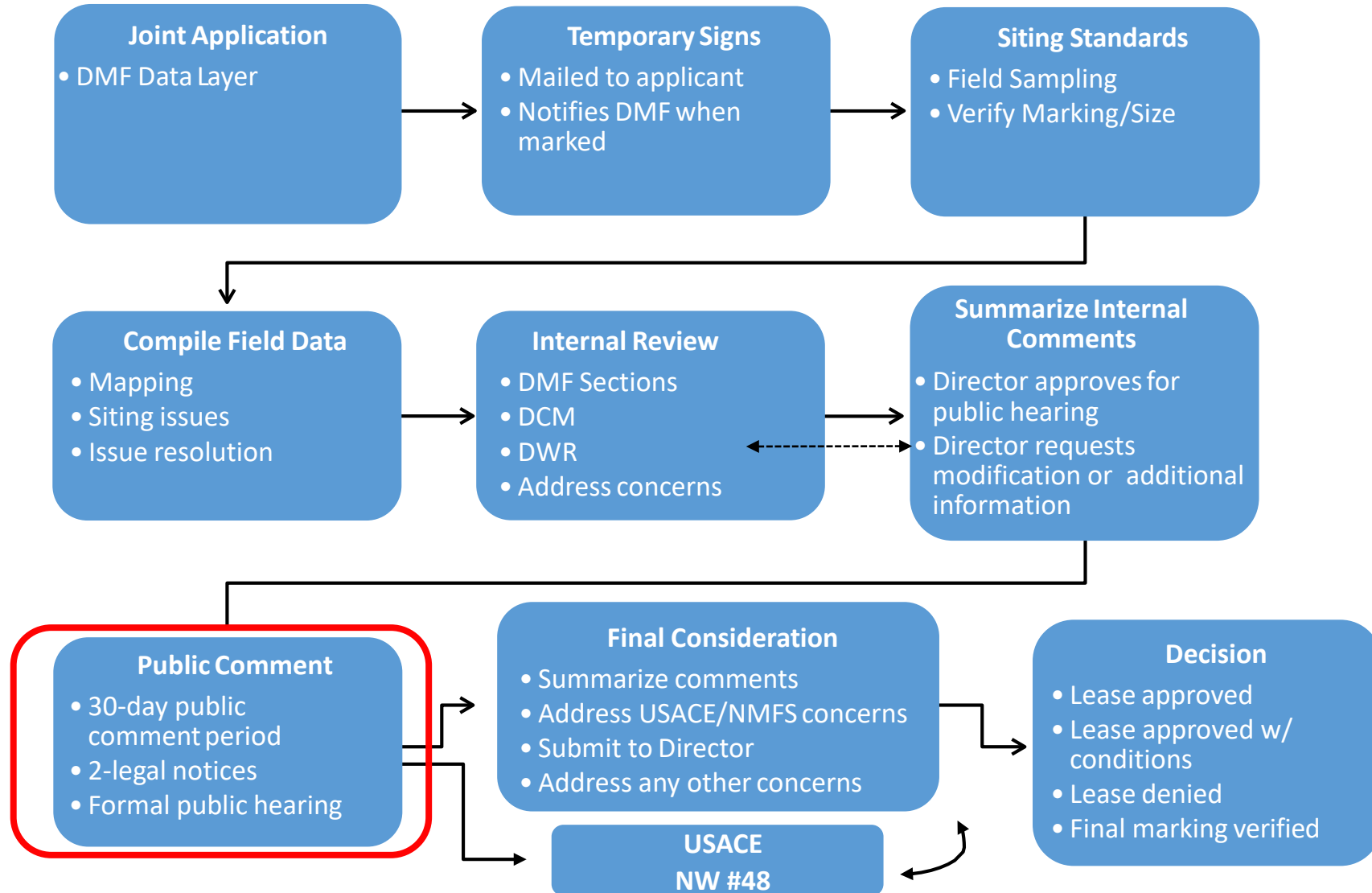


Shellfish Leases are Governed by Law

- Shellfish Leases in General Statutes
 - NCGS Chapter 113 Article 16
 - Changes to Shellfish Leases
 - 26 Session Laws Since 1997 (FRA)
 - 48 Total Changes to General Statutes

- Navigation and Depth

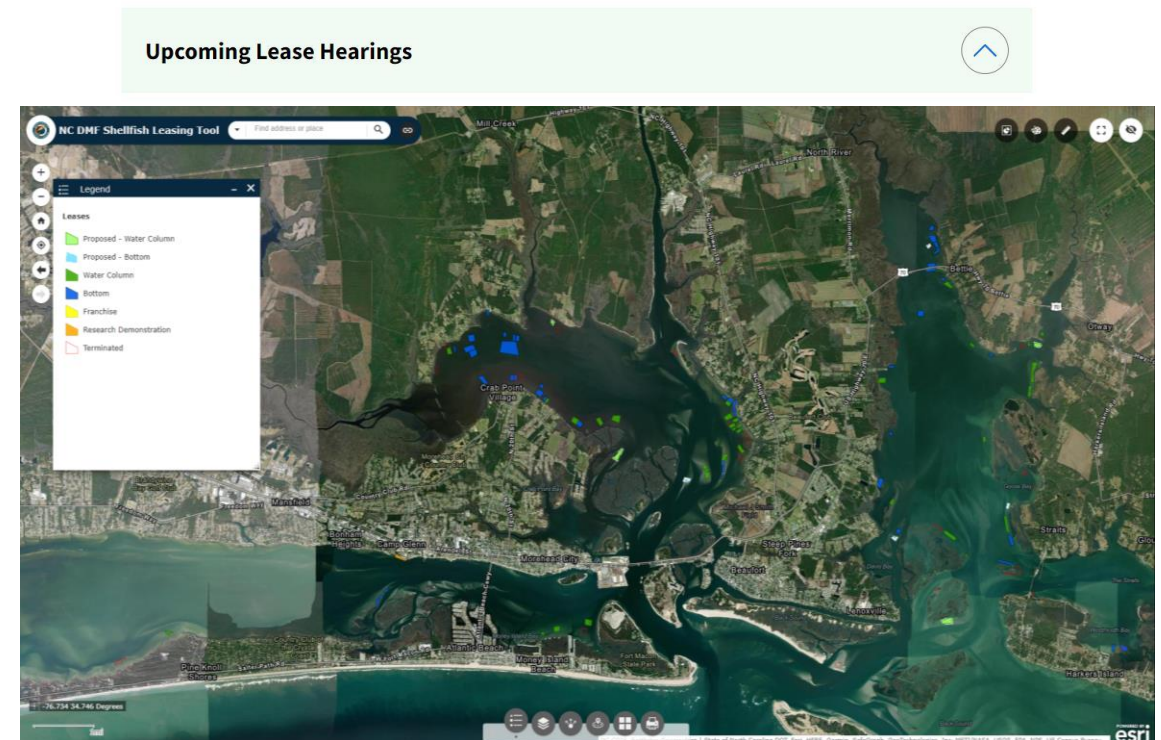

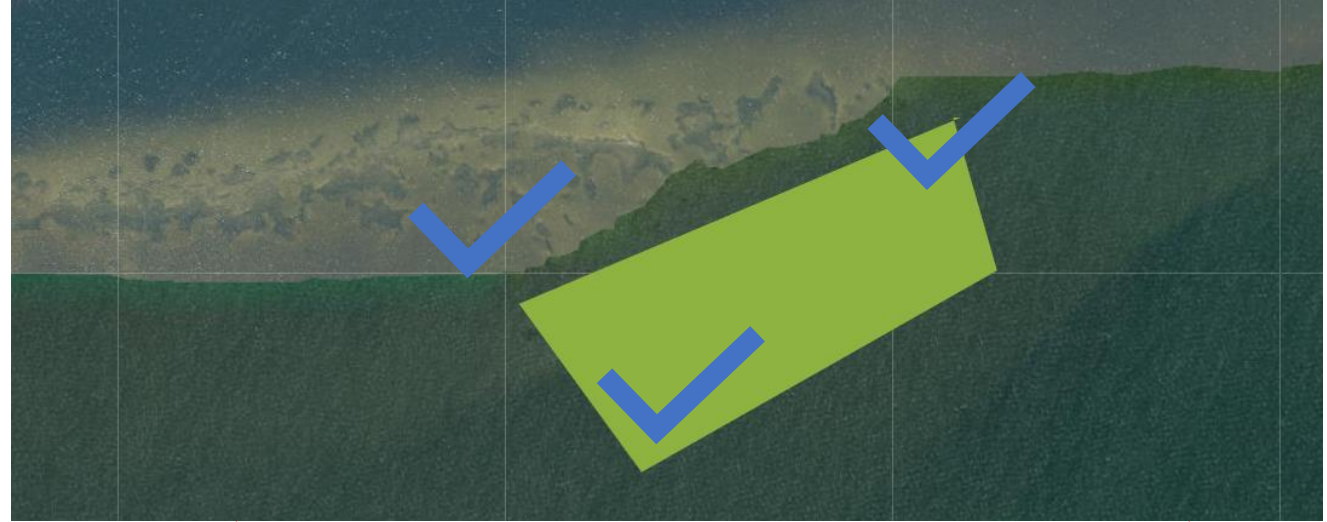

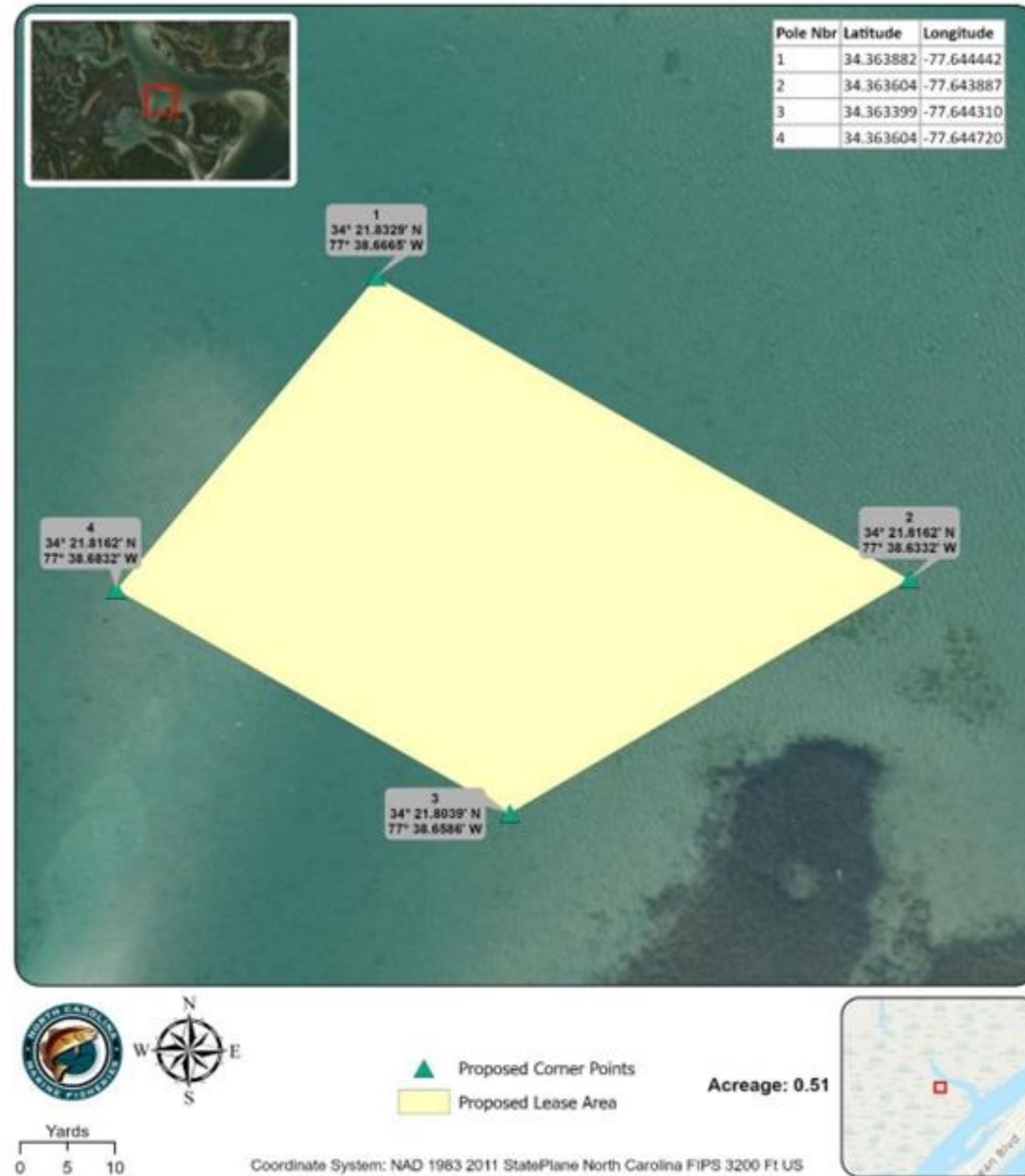
