PROCLAMATION

RE: SHELLFISH POLLUTED AREA

Kathy B. Rawls, Director, Division of Marine Fisheries, upon the recommendation of Dr. Lawrence Greenblatt, State Health Director, Department of Health and Human Services, hereby announces that the following changes in shellfish harvesting areas will take effect at sunrise, Thursday, August 21, 2025.

All those waters in Brunswick and Pamlico Counties will return to the status in existence immediately prior to the July 31, August 1, and August 15, 2025, temporary closures **except the following which remain closed:**

BRUNSWICK COUNTY

Shalotte River – All those waters in Shalotte River upstream of a line beginning at a point 33° 54.8302' N - 78° 22.3626' W near Bowen Point; running southeasterly to a point 33° 54.6139' N - 78° 21.7667' W on Long Point.

All those waters between IWW Beacon “1” near Southport and the permanent closure line near the Holden Beach Bridge, to include Lockwoods Folly River and the Lockwoods Folly Inlet area.

The following also remains closed:

NEW HANOVER / PENDER / ONSLOW / CARTERET COUNTIES

All those waters from the Intracoastal Waterway to the mainland between IWW Marker “105” (34° 19.4274' N - 77° 42.9507' W) near Green Channel and IWW Marker “122” (34° 15.2045' N - 77° 46.7760' W) near Howe Creek, to include the Intracoastal Waterway, Pages Creek, and Futch Creek.

All those waters from the Intracoastal Waterway to the mainland in Stump Sound between the North Topsail High Rise Bridge and Beacon “49” near Morris Landing, to include the Intracoastal Waterway, Kings Creek, and Turkey Creek.

All those waters in Chadwick Bay bordered on the north by a line beginning at a point 34° 33.0934' N - 77° 21.6926' W on the mainland near Hatch Point, running easterly near Marker “76” to New River Inlet Channel Beacon “12”, thence running southerly following the dredged channel to the eastern tip of North Topsail Beach at New River Inlet; and bordered on the south by a line beginning at a point 34° 31.1227' N - 77° 22.3142' W on the mainland, running southerly near Beacon “15” to a point 34° 31.0527' N - 77° 22.2654' W on North Topsail Beach.

Queens Creek - All those waters in Queens Creek upstream of a straight line across the mouth, beginning at a point 34° 39.8479' N - 77° 09.1171' W on the west shore; running northeasterly to a point 34° 40.2031' N - 77° 08.4408' W on the east shore near the State Park Boat Ramp.

All those waters from the Intracoastal Waterway to the mainland between the Emerald Isle High Rise Bridge and IWW Marker “45A” (34° 40.3904' N - 77° 05.9365' W), to include the Intracoastal Waterway.


All those waters from the Intracoastal Waterway to the mainland in Bogue Sound between IWW Beacon “29” and IWW Beacon “33”, to include the Intracoastal Waterway and Sanders Creek.

Newport River - All those waters in Newport River upstream of a straight line beginning at a point 34° 45.6646' N – 76° 44.0603' W on the south shore near Lawton Point, running northerly to a point 34° 46.5724' N -76° 44.3786' W on the north shore just upstream of Hammock Rock.

North River – All those waters in North River upstream of the North River Bridge.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- A. This proclamation is issued under the authority of N.C.G.S. 113-170.4; 113-170.5; 113-182; 113-221.1; 143B-289.52 and N.C. Marine Fisheries Commission Rules 15A NCAC 03H .0103 and 03K .0101.
- B. It is unlawful to violate the provisions of any proclamation issued by the N.C. Fisheries Director under his delegated authority pursuant to N.C. Marine Fisheries Commission Rule 15A NCAC 03H .0103.
- C. In accordance with N.C. General Statute 113-221.1(c) all persons who may be affected by proclamations issued by the Fisheries Director are under a duty to keep themselves informed of current proclamations.
- D. This proclamation returns the following areas to normal closure boundaries: Tubbs Inlet, Ocean Isle Beach, a portion of the Intracoastal Waterway near Holden Beach, Bay River, Jones Bay, and Oyster Creek (Pamlico County).
- E. These reopenings are due to satisfactory bacteriological sampling results.
