The Oil and Gas Conservation Act

Created for:

- a. The protection of public interests
- b. The protection of correlative mineral rights
- c. The prevention of waste
- d. The protection of the environment through regulation

The Oil and Gas Commission

Created by:

- a. NC General Statutes Chapter 143 B
- b. The Executive Organization Act of 1973
- c. And in Chapter 113 of the Conservation and Development Statutes

The Oil and Gas Commission

Directed to:

Establish a modern regulatory program for the management of oil and gas development

The Oil and Gas Commission

The regulatory program shall be designed to:

- Protect public health and safety
- Protect public and private property
- Protect and Conserve the State's air, water and natural resources
- Expand employment opportunities
- Provide for the productive and efficient development of the State's oil and gas resources

OGC Meetings

- OGC shall meet at least once per quarter
 - Required by N.C.G.S. 143B-293.5
- Regular attendance is a duty of each Commissioner
 - General Assembly appointees
 - Their position becomes vacant if three consecutive meetings are missed
 - Exception is sickness
 - Governor appointees
 - Their position may constitute grounds for removal if attendance falls below 75%
