In contrast to past years' annual state reports, this report from Orange County NC Solid Waste Management Department includes the financial information on all the programs and divisions of Orange County's Solid Waste Management Department including the Sanitation Division for which we formerly submitted a separate report. Thus the information on costs and costs per ton for the category of solid waste will differ significantly from those shown in past years. The MSW budget overall set forth in question 65 is the budget for the Sanitation Divison which includes all Waste and Recycling Centers, which include some costs that are related to recycling collection. For the other two categories, of recycling and yard waste, we attempted to keep the costs and tonnages from those two program areas comparable to past years' submittals.

Overall recycling tonnage declined by 2,451 tons or 12% due in part to the following: Food Waste collected by the County declined 30% or 572 tons because two large generators were removed from the program to private collection. Separated cardboard declined 11% or 142 tons. Drop off site recycling declined 11% or 282 tons due to permanent loss of one of the four unstaffed sites and temporary removal for ¾ of the year of recycling collection at a staffed site during its reconstruction. A decline of 44% or 932 tons in scrap metal and white goods collected compared to 2016-17.

Lead acid batteries weight has increased compared to recent years, and again there is no explanation known for that increase as there was no known explanation for the prior declines.

We believe this information is valuable for all solid waste practitioners and we provide it to the best of our ability and knowledge to be added to the overall State data base.

We strongly encourage the State of North Carolina to continue its renowned, effective and highly useful solid waste programs, reporting and staffing.
