Project Description: The proposed project will make improvements at Town's wastewater treatment plan: replacement of three (3) influent pumps with VFDs and valves; rehabilitation of the existing mechanical bar screen; installation of VFD motor drives for existing mechanical aerators in upper aeration basin; rehabilitation of upper clarifier; rehabilitation and replacement of RAS pumps; modifications to the digester consisting of replacement of existing mixer with an aerator and improvements to the decant system; relocation and replacement of chlorine contact basin with liquid chlorine feed system, and associated appurtenances.

The above named applicant will receive funding assistance from the State Revolving Fund. The North Carolina Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) has conducted a review of the project in accordance with the NCGS §159G-38. The Division has determined that this project is below the minor construction activities threshold outlined in 15A NCAC 01C .0408; therefore, the project is exempt from inter-agency review, and the preparation of additional environmental documents is not required.
