Project Description: The proposed project will rehabilitate the Town's Waste Water Treatment Plant to improve effluent quality, prevent future component failure, improve equipment reliability, and improve the working environment. The following improvements are planned: (1) rehabilitation of two clarifiers; (2) replace RAS pump and force main; (3) replace seven (7) aeration basin and digester blowers, replace DO probes, and re-program blower control system; (4) replace generator; (5) make lab/office building improvements; (6) improve headworks including installing a second grinder, rehabilitating the screen and installing a septage receiving station; and (7) improve sludge handling facilities including construction of a separate sludge holding tank.

The above named applicant will receive funding assistance from the State Revolving Fund program to construct the wastewater facilities described above. The North Carolina Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) has conducted a review of the project in accordance with the procedures (NCAC 15A Subchapter 1C) for conformance with the North Carolina Environmental Policy Act. The Division has determined that this project is below the minor construction activities threshold outlined in 15A NCAC 01C .0408; therefore, the project is exempt from inter-agency review, and the preparation of additional environmental documents is not required.

This determination shall become effective upon its distribution by the Division and will be available on the Division's website (http://portal.ncdenr.org/web/wi/fonsi-dmca-ce). This determination can be revoked at any time adverse information is made available. The documentation to support this decision will be on file with the North Carolina Department of Environment and Natural Resources, Division of Water Infrastructure, and is available for public scrutiny upon request.
