The Division of Water Infrastructure (Division) has completed its review of the subject engineering report. Based upon this review, the Division has determined that the referenced project is eligible for funding as follows:

Eligible

CCTV of approximately 8,200 linear feet of 8-inch and 10-inch gravity sewer; find-and-fix rehabilitation/replacement of 7,700 LF of 8-inch and 500 LF of 10-inch gravity sewer pipe with like sizes; rehabilitation of 30 manholes; and replacement of 80 service laterals.

Non Eligible

Paving of roadways in excess of the excavated area. Any installation of sewer service laterals outside the right-of-way. Spare parts, service contracts, maintenance contracts, and extended warranties.

Based upon detailed review of the bid documents, the Division may determine that portions of the project are not eligible for funding and the total funding amount may be reduced.

Project Description: The proposed project will make the following improvements in the Town's Braewick Road sewer basin: CCTV of approximately 8,200 linear feet of 8-inch and 10-inch gravity sewer; find-and-fix rehabilitation/replacement of 7,700 LF of 8-inch and 500 LF of 10-inch gravity sewer pipe with like sizes; rehabilitation of 30 manholes; and replacement of 80 service laterals.
