

**SUMMARY OF NOTICE OF  
INTENT TO REDEVELOP A BROWNFIELDS PROPERTY**  
**Brownfields Property Name: Texfi Haw River II**  
**Brownfields Project Number: 22083-18-001**

Pursuant to the North Carolina Brownfields Property Reuse Act (the “Act”) authorized by North Carolina General Statutes (NCGS) § 130A-310.30 through 130A-310.40, and specifically pursuant to NCGS § 130A-310.34, Cora Holt Mill, LLC, as Prospective Developer, has filed with the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (“DEQ”) a Notice of Intent to Redevelop a Brownfields Property (“Brownfields Property”) located at 115, 121, 205 Stone Street and unaddressed parcels on Stone Street, Haw River, Alamance County. The Brownfields Property, which is the former site of a textile mill that conducted both dry and wet processing activities and included dyeing, chemical storage, an electrical substation, coal-fired boilers and associated coal storage, and a lagoon that was used for steam, cooling water, and fire suppression, consists of 13.46 acres. Environmental contamination exists on the Brownfields Property in soil, groundwater, exterior soil gas, sub-slab vapor, surface water and sediment. Cora Holt Mill, LLC has committed itself to redevelop the Brownfields Property for no uses other than high-density residential, associated amenity space, open space, recreation, parking, and subject to DEQ’s prior written approval, other commercial uses. The Notice of Intent to Redevelop a Brownfields Property includes: (1) a proposed Brownfields Agreement between DEQ and Cora Holt Mill, LLC, which in turn includes (a) a map showing the location of the Property, (b) a description of the contaminants involved and their concentrations in the media of the Property, (c) the above-stated description of the intended future use of the Brownfields Property, and (d) proposed investigation and remediation; and (2) a proposed Notice of Brownfields Property prepared in accordance with NCGS § 130A-310.35.

The Act requires a public comment period of at least 30 days. The first day of public comment is defined as the day after which all of the following public notice tasks have occurred: the date this Notice is: (1) published in a newspaper of general circulation serving the area in which the Brownfields Property is located; (2) conspicuously posted at the Brownfields Property; and (3) mailed or delivered to each owner of property contiguous to the Brownfields Property. Written public comments may be submitted to DEQ within 30 days after the public comment period begins. Written requests for a public meeting may be submitted to DEQ within 21 days after the public comment period begins. These periods will start no sooner than **July 23, 2025** and will end no later of: 1) 30 and 21 days, respectively, after that; or 2) 30 and 21 days, respectively, after completion of the latest of the three (3) above-referenced tasks, if such completion occurs later than the date stated herein.
