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DRY-CLEANING SOLVENT CLEANUP ACT ANNUAL REPORT

Executive Summary

As required by the Dry-Cleaning Solvent Cleanup Act (DSCA) of 1997 and amendments (G.S. 143-215.104A *et seq.*), this report provides an annual update on activities conducted in the DSCA Program in fiscal year (FY) 2011-12. The DSCA of 1997 and its amendments created a fund for assessment and cleanup of dry-cleaning solvent environmental contamination at dry-cleaning and wholesale distribution facilities, and also authorized the program to develop and enforce rules relating to the prevention of dry-cleaning solvent releases at operating facilities.

Since the start of the DSCA Program, the N.C. Department of Environment and Natural Resources' (DENR) Division of Waste Management (DWM) has identified 372 operating or abandoned dry-cleaning facilities with environmental contamination by dry-cleaning solvent. Of these, 299 have been certified into the DSCA Program.

During the life of the DSCA Program, significant progress has been made in all aspects of program implementation. The following accomplishments are noted for site remediation and protection of human health:

- 27 sites closed
- 21 sites identified as ready for closure
- 41 residences and 10 businesses were provided clean water (at 13 sites)
- 12 residences and 43 businesses were provided with vapor mitigation measures due to migration of contaminant vapors into occupied buildings (at 33 sites)
- 55 sites had soil cleanups
- 38 sites began initial groundwater remediation

DWM delivered educational outreach activities at 733 active dry-cleaning facilities in North Carolina. This educational assistance provided owners and operators with training and information to help them comply with environmental regulations. Full compliance inspections are now performed at facilities where violations were identified during the educational outreach visits to ensure corrections were made.

The DSCA Fund continues to be solvent, with a fund balance of approximately \$13.9 million and encumbered funds totaling \$9.8 million. The increase in the fund balance over last year is attributed to an increase in receipts along with the program's efforts to balance expenditures with incoming monies to help ensure that the DSCA Fund remains solvent. Based on an average site cleanup cost of \$330,000, approximately \$100 million will be needed to address the 299 sites currently certified in the program. DENR estimates there may be as many as 1,500 contaminated dry-cleaning sites in North Carolina. Projected costs to clean up just half of those sites would exceed \$250 million.

Program Activity

The General Assembly enacted DSCA to: 1) Clean up contamination from dry-cleaning solvents at both retail dry-cleaners and wholesale solvent distribution sites and 2) protect human health and the environment by preventing future dry-cleaning solvent contamination. DENR made significant progress during fiscal year 2011-12 in implementing the cleanup and compliance components of DSCA.

Site Cleanups

During the past fiscal year, DWM directed significant energy towards assessment and remediation of sites with contamination from dry-cleaning solvents. DWM continued to implement initiatives to ensure protection of human health by mitigating vapor intrusion (indoor air pollution from solvent contamination in the soil or groundwater) and providing clean water supplies to residents and businesses.

Sites in Program

Table 1 provides current statistics for sites certified into the DSCA Program. A site becomes certified when a petitioner enters into an assessment and remediation agreement with DWM. A list of certified sites along with current site status is shown in Appendix A. During FY 2011-12, DWM staff and the program's six independent contractors performed the following activities:

- screened sites for imminent hazards such as threatened water supply wells and vapor intrusion into buildings;
- abated indoor vapor hazards from contaminated soils and groundwater;
- provided temporary and permanent clean water supplies;
- conducted comprehensive site assessments delineating extent of contamination;
- remediated contaminated soil;
- remediated contaminated groundwater; and
- evaluated site risks and prepared sites for closure.

Rules that establish a risk-based approach to assessing and cleaning up certified sites in the DSCA Program became effective on Oct. 1, 2007. These rules and associated guidance allow program staff to determine the risk posed to human health and the environment at each site and, if necessary, to calculate the appropriate cleanup levels for soil and groundwater.

Since the start of the DSCA Program, 27 DSCA sites have been closed. DWM has determined that no further remediation will be required at an additional 21 sites (see "Sites Pending Closure" in Table 1). The closure process consists of the preparation of a risk management plan that typically includes land-use restrictions and a plat map of the site. DSCA requires that these documents be provided to the appropriate local governments (counties and municipalities) and also made available to the public through publication in local newspapers, direct mailings to property owners on or adjacent to the contamination site and by posting a notice at the site.

At 13 dry-cleaning sites, DWM has taken immediate action to ensure that 41 residences and 10 businesses with contaminated water supply wells were connected to municipal waterlines, or

provided a clean water source until such connections can be made. Addressing indoor air pollution from tetrachloroethylene (PERC) releases continues to be a high priority, since many DSCA sites have occupied structures on or adjacent to the PERC contamination. Testing has identified a number of buildings where soil and/or groundwater contamination has produced unacceptably high concentrations of PERC vapor in indoor air that required mitigation. Such mitigation has been undertaken at 26 DSCA sites where vapor control systems were installed at 12 residences and 43 businesses into which contaminant vapors were intruding.

Soil and/or groundwater cleanup is needed at many DSCA sites to protect human health and the environment. Soil remedies, including excavation, treatment and soil-vapor extraction, have been conducted at 55 sites to remove contaminant sources that threaten indoor air in buildings and cause further degradation of groundwater. Groundwater remedies have been initiated at 38 locations to help control further degradation and to reduce threats to indoor air.

Alternative Solvent Study

In 2000, the North Carolina General Assembly directed the formation of a working group to study dry-cleaning processes and equipment that could be implemented as potential alternatives to the predominant existing dry-cleaning technologies, especially those that use PERC. This group was comprised of a variety of stakeholders, including representatives from conservation groups, the dry-cleaning industry, dry-cleaning equipment and solvent manufacturers, researchers and government agencies. The group submitted a final report to the General Assembly in 2001 detailing findings and offering recommendations for consideration. At the time, the N.C. Department of Health and Human Services (NC DHHS) concluded that PERC, as used in the dry-cleaning industry, did not pose a significant human health risk to the general population; however, the report did not evaluate the health effects of solvent vapors to people in other businesses co-located with dry cleaners.

During 2009, the DSCA program discovered elevated PERC concentrations in indoor air that were caused by highly contaminated soil and groundwater underlying a former dry-cleaning building. As a result, the program initiated procedures to evaluate vapor intrusion into structures that once housed dry-cleaning operations and into tenant spaces adjacent to operating PERC cleaners where the spaces share a common roof. Such testing indicated that elevated PERC levels in some tenant spaces appeared to be caused by vapors from the normal operations of the dry cleaner rather than from contaminated soil or groundwater. Based on the DSCA program's vapor intrusion investigations and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) June 2008 proposal to modify PERC's cancer risk classification from a possible carcinogen to a likely human carcinogen, the NC DHHS agreed to reevaluate its conclusion, made in the 2001 report.

A new study group, led by DWM and composed of stakeholders representing industry, environmental conservation, government and academic organizations, formed in September 2010 to reevaluate the conclusions of the 2001 alternatives study in light of this new information. In December 2011, the NC DHHS completed its review of PERC human health risk assessment information and recommended that the DSCA Program reevaluate its occupational inhalation screening levels for PERC when EPA provides its final guidance values. In February 2012, EPA released its Final Health Assessment for Tetrachloroethylene (PERC) that concludes that PERC is a "likely human carcinogen," and provides estimates for

both cancer and non-cancer effects associated with exposure to PERC over a lifetime. The study group will evaluate this new information and incorporate it into the final report of its findings and recommendations.

Site Prioritization System

DSCA requires that site cleanup disbursements be made on higher priority sites first. Recent information obtained from the program's vapor intrusion investigations indicates that this type of direct human exposure is occurring at a number of DSCA sites. To ensure that this particular health concern receives appropriate attention, the program has revised its prioritization method and DSCA is currently refining a process to incorporate the new system into its planning and budgeting of available funds.

DSCA Amendment

Many sites with dry-cleaning solvent contamination require land-use restrictions to prevent use or installation of water supply wells on the property because of groundwater contamination that remains even after remediation has been completed. S.L. 2011-186 included a provision requiring DENR to notify owners of property subject to land-use restrictions applied pursuant to a DSCA cleanup if the owners failed to provide an annual certification that the restrictions were being maintained. The notice would allow 30 calendar days for the owners to respond before enforcement actions could be taken.

Investigation of Potential New Sites

An amendment to DSCA that went into effect in 2007 allowed the program to spend up to one percent of the DSCA fund balance each year to identify active and abandoned dry-cleaning sites that the program believes may be contaminated. If contamination is found that is attributed to a facility, the potential responsible party may be given the choice of entering the program as a petitioner or allowing the site to be addressed under the Inactive Hazardous Sites Program. If they choose the latter, the responsible party is required to reimburse the program for all of the investigation costs. Since 2007, the program has initiated limited investigations at 67 sites with potential dry-cleaning solvent contamination. Forty-two of those sites have petitioned and been certified into the DSCA Program.

The program uses a variety of sources to identify new sites across the state. Data from DENR's Inactive Hazardous Sites program, Underground Storage Tank program and Public Water Supply program reveal water supply well samples containing contaminants that may have originated from dry-cleaning operations. The locations of more than 2,000 active and abandoned dry-cleaning facilities are used to identify those that are close to the contaminated wells. Analysis of this data has helped the program identify a number of sites where DSCA contractors will perform sampling using the one percent investigative allowance.

DSCA Contracts

The program currently manages six contracts, with a total encumbrance of \$9.8 million. The purpose of the contracts is to establish terms and conditions by which qualified environmental engineering firms assess and remediate contaminated dry-cleaning sites in the DSCA Program.

Identified Contamination Sites

A total of 372 sites known or suspected to be contaminated by dry-cleaning solvents have been reported to DWM. As noted in Table 1, 299 of these sites have been certified into the program. Appendix A provides a list, by county, of all of the 372 sites known/suspected to be contaminated with dry-cleaning solvent and the subset that have been certified into the program. A total of 21 new dry-cleaning solvent releases were reported to DWM during fiscal year 2011-2012. As noted above, the program anticipates that additional contamination sites will be identified using the one percent investigative allowance in 2012.

Outreach

DWM staff continue to provide training on the cleanup program upon request. A brochure describing the program has been produced. Letters have been sent to property owners of former dry-cleaning facilities to inform them of the potential for contamination and the benefits that are provided by the program. The DSCA website is used to distribute program documents and data to the public.

Facility Compliance

The Environmental Management Commission has been authorized under DSCA to develop rules that operating dry-cleaning facilities must follow to prevent environmental contamination by dry-cleaning solvents. These rules, or minimum management practices (MMPs), were adopted in 2001 as temporary rules and approved as permanent rules in 2002. In 2005, the DSCA Program created and filled a new staff position that coordinates compliance assistance visits and formal inspections of facilities and also serves as the lead for enforcement actions where necessary.

In addition to the program's MMP regulations, DWM also entered into a memorandum-of-agreement with the N.C. Division of Air Quality that enables DWM staff to perform compliance inspections for air quality regulations that are applicable to dry-cleaning facilities. Enforcement authority is delegated to the DWM for violations of the air quality rules. This allows one program in DENR to ensure compliance with all environmental regulatory requirements and gives dry cleaners and the public a single DENR point-of-contact for compliance questions or concerns.

Educational Assistance Visits

DWM inspectors have provided educational assistance to 733 active dry-cleaning facilities, many of which had never been inspected by a DENR program. This outreach trains owners and operators regarding the MMPs, RCRA and air quality regulations. Inspectors also use these visits to thoroughly document all observed compliance issues.

Inspections and Enforcement

Full compliance inspections are being conducted at facilities where violations were identified during the outreach visits to ensure that sufficient corrections have been made. During fiscal year 2011-2012, 351 full inspections were performed at 337 facilities, and outreach visits performed at 13 facilities. Identified violations included discharge of solvent-containing water; failure to install a spill containment pan under the dry-cleaning machine; failure to use a closed solvent connection to transfer new solvent into the machine; failure to properly containerize and store waste solvent in spill containment; and failure to record and maintain National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants, or NESHAP, recordkeeping logs.

Additional Compliance Outreach

Since 2007, the DSCA Program has produced a PERC compliance calendar that provides all applicable rules, recordkeeping, guidance and reference information in one document for the convenience of facility owners and operators. The program mailed or hand-delivered 496 PERC compliance calendars to 414 PERC dry cleaning facilities across the state. The calendar has received positive reviews from both dry-cleaners in North Carolina and industry officials in other states, where it has been praised for its comprehensive scope and functionality.

Program Financial Status and Projections

Fund Receipts and Disbursements

The primary funding sources for the dry-cleaning solvent cleanup fund are a tax on dry-cleaning solvents, the state portion of the current sales tax on dry-cleaning, deductible payments from petitioners participating in the cleanup program and interest earned on the account. Disbursements consist primarily of payments to the program's independent contractors for site assessment and remediation, reimbursements to petitioners for past-cost claims and program administration costs.

The DSCA Fund's finances through fiscal year 2011-12 (ending June 30, 2012) are summarized below:

Estimated Future Assessment and Remediation Expenditures

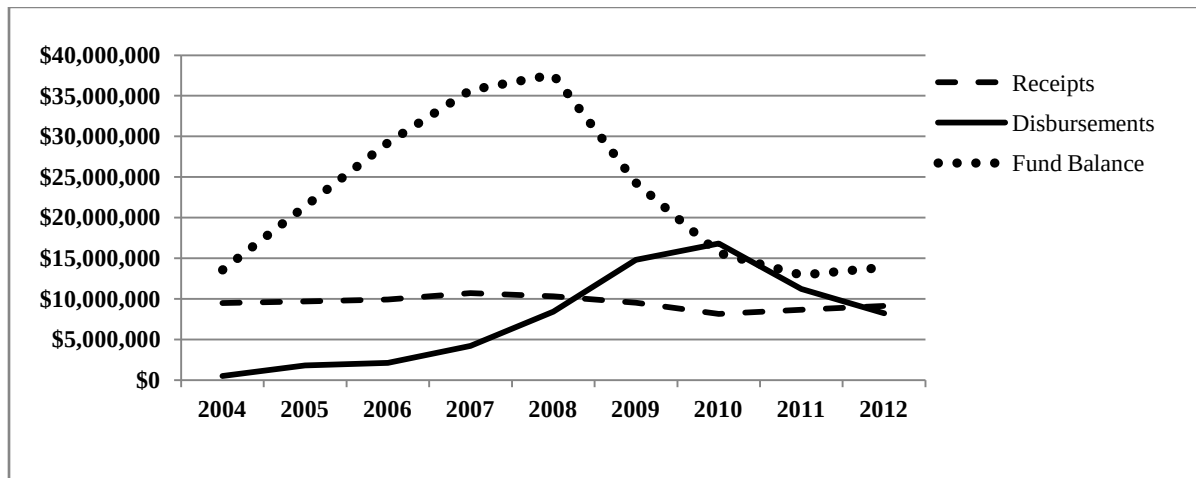
During fiscal year 2011-12, fund expenditures directly related to implementation of DSCA decreased from previous years (see DSCA Related Disbursements in Table 2 and Figure 1). This reduction resulted from the need to balance expenditures with incoming receipts in combination with implementing a revised prioritization system to ensure that available funds are spent properly. Site work expenditures have reduced the fund balance from its peak of \$37.6 million in 2008 to \$12.9 million in 2011. Fund receipts increased approximately \$1 million from 2010 to 2012, primarily due to the one percent sales tax increase in 2009, which accrued in 2010 and is now reflected in the incoming receipts. However, revenues from the dry-cleaning solvent tax have steadily declined since 2004. The Fund balance for fiscal year 2011-2012 increased to \$13.9 million due to the increase in overall receipts and the overall decrease in expenditures.

Based on cost figures provided by other states, DSCA can calculate an approximate total cleanup cost for those sites that have been certified into the program. Using an average total cleanup cost of \$330,000 per site, approximately \$100 million (not including DENR's administrative costs) will be needed to address the 299 sites currently certified in the program. Based on data from the N. C. Department of Labor, at least 2,000 active and abandoned dry-cleaning facilities exist in the state. Investigations performed across the nation indicate that contamination is present in about 75 percent of all dry-cleaning operations. Applying this percentage to the number of current and former facilities in North Carolina, a total of 1,500 contaminated sites may be present, equaling an estimated \$500 million in cleanup costs. If only half of these contaminated sites are accepted into the DSCA Program, the projected total cleanup cost (adjusted for inflation) would be approximately \$250 million.

DSCA Administrative Costs

According to DSCA, up to 20 percent of annual revenues deposited into the fund may be used by DENR and the N.C. Attorney General's Office to administer the program. The decline in annual receipts since 2008 combined with the gradual growth of the program have resulted in the administrative costs-to-revenue ratio increasing from 10.5 percent to 16.7 percent. This ratio has remained unchanged over the past two years.

Actions to Ensure Fund Solvency

From 2008 and until 2011, the increased expenditures on site cleanups had substantially reduced the fund balance. During 2012, receipts increased and the program's prioritization measures successfully controlled expenditures resulting in a limited increase in the fund balance. Measures controlling expenditures must be monitored to help ensure that sites requiring remediation are addressed in priority order while maintaining fund solvency.

As noted above, total collections for fiscal 2011-12 were approximately \$9.1 million. The fund has a balance of approximately \$13.9 million, with encumbered monies totaling \$9.8 million. The DSCA Fund is solvent.
