Notice of Intent to Remediate

In addition to the public participation requirements of the applicable remediation program, the person who proposes to remediate a site according to Part 8 of Article 9 of Chapter 130A of the North Carolina General Statutes must notify all interested parties of the intent to remediate the site to site-specific clean up levels in lieu of state standards.

Instructions:

- 1. Complete the Notice of Intent to Remediate (NOIR) form on the following page.
- 2. Compile a mailing list which shall, at a minimum, include
 - all owners of contaminated property,
 - all owners of property to which the contamination is expected to migrate,
 - all owners of land adjoining contaminated parcels and parcels to which contaminants are expected to migrate, and
 - local governments having taxing or land-use jurisdiction over the property.

This is a notice to the public of a request by the Remediating Party to pursue remediation of the environmental contamination at the above-identified site using site-specific cleanup standards and institutional controls to mitigate unacceptable risk to human health and the environment. Once the N.C. Department of Environmental Quality (NC DEQ) receives the proposed remedial action plan, a second public notice will be issued providing for a 30-day public comment period.
