- 47. Special Event/Festival Recycling When applicants apply for a Special Use Permit, as a condition of approval of the permit, we insist that the applicant provide recycling containers as well as trash containers at the special event.

Beach Clean Up Activities - The county maintains two 30-yard open top containers for beach clean up activities. One container is for trash, the other is to deposit recyclable material that has been collected from the beaches under beach clean up activities.

NCDA Pesticide - US Ag Recycling has not submitted their report at this time.

- **Page 10, Line 84: Contract cost for scrap tire disposal is by the haul, rates vary from points of origin. \$ 538 \$ 608 per haul depending on origin.
- 95. Our Emergency Operations Plan states: "Agriculture is represented by the Cooperative Extension Service Director and is responsible for all issues concerning agriculture including assessing crop, livestock and their product damages that may result from the loss suffered in a disaster. This person will keep the EOC advised regarding agriculture losses or the potential of such losses. This person is also responsible for the coordination of the removal of dead farm animals and/or the decontamination of such animals."

Currently, Currituck has no commercial livestock operations so the likelyhood of needing a response in this manner is very small. Our largest potential for loss would be equine, but they are not concentrated to a single area and there are evacuation centers around the state for equine.
