.Question # 41 in light of Question # 45- C and D Materials Collected: Scrap metal is reused/recycled at the location and bricks and concrete are reused as landfill road base. Since it is reuse and re-purposed it will not be counted as recycled and tons will not be shown in the table. (Communications with county staff last year on 9-8-16 - DH)

Question 45-School Commingled recyclables: The 161.78 tons of materials collected under school recycling are traditional commingled recyclable such as plastic bottles, metals, glass, office paper, etc. These tons are shown in the commingled "Other" program tons of this table (Communications with county staff 10-2-2017 and consistent with last years' report -DH).

Question 45- Metals: All metals were recycled this year and not re used at the landfill like last year (9-29-2017-DH)
