Disposal costs were the largest factor in electronics management as you can see our cost deficit of over \$32,000.

Question # 44 and Question # 45: School Recycling: The county staff estimates it collected 50 tons of comminged recycled materials from the school recycling program. All costs associated with school recycling are paid for out of the Richmond County Solid Waste Budget. The county provides eight cubic yard recycling containers to the participating schools. These are picked up by front loader truck. If electronics need to be recycled they are brought to the transfer station by the school maintenance staff and sent in with the other electronics managed by the county. There is no single administrator managing the school recycling efforts. This is done by individual school staff persons. The following schools participate in Richmond County's school recycling:
