Project Description: *The Town of Plymouth is modernizing its aging water system by replacing over 3,700 feet of cast iron and galvanized mains with PVC pipe, renewing 40 service connections, and installing new hydrants and valves. These upgrades will resolve long-standing low-pressure issues, reduce water loss from leaks, and improve both reliability and fire protection for residents.*

The above-named applicant will receive funding assistance from the State Revolving Fund. The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Water Infrastructure (**Division**) has conducted a review of the project in accordance with the NCGS §159G-38. The Division has determined that this project is below the minor construction activities threshold outlined in the 15A NCAC 01C .0408; therefore, the project is exempt from inter-agency review, and the preparation of additional environmental documents is not required.

This determination shall become effective upon its distribution by the Division and will be available on the Division's website (<https://deq.nc.gov/about/divisions/water-infrastructure/division-water-infrastructure/environmental-documents>). This determination can be revoked at any time adverse information is made available. The documentation to support this decision will be on file with the Division, and is available for public scrutiny upon request.
