Guidance for When Multiple Permits May be Required

In some cases, one stormwater program satisfies the requirements of another (such as the Neuse NSW for Phase II); however, in other cases, multiple permits and/or programs apply. The interactive map should indicate multiple programs in either the "NOTE" or other fields.

This list provides supplemental guidance about when more than one permit may be required. **DWQ began** implementing Phase II post-construction requirements on July 1, 2007. **DWQ began** implementing the new Coastal Stormwater Rule requirements on October 1, 2008.

- Where WS-III or WS-IV Watersheds overlap Coastal (CAMA) Counties or ORW water boundaries:
 Contact the <u>DWQ Regional Office</u> for a State Stormwater (SSW) permit. Please verify with the local <u>Water Supply Watershed Program</u> jurisdiction that WS requirements are met.
- Where WS-III or WS-IV Watersheds overlap HQW or ORW water boundaries: Contact the <u>DWQ</u>
 <u>Regional Office</u> for a SSW permit. Please verify with the local <u>Water Supply Watershed Program</u>
 jurisdiction that WS requirements are met.
- Where WS-I or WS-II Watersheds overlap ORW water boundaries: Contact the <u>DWQ Regional</u>
 <u>Office</u> for a State Stormwater (SSW) permit. Please verify with the local <u>Water Supply Watershed</u>
 <u>Program</u> jurisdiction that WS requirements are met.
- Where Phase II areas overlap coastal (CAMA) counties: If the development is in an <u>incorporated</u> area, go to the local government for a Post-Construction permit. If the program hasn't started there yet, contact the <u>DWQ Regional Office</u>. In an <u>unincorporated</u> area, you must contact the DWQ Regional Office for a Post-Construction permit (Coastal Stormwater Rules apply).
- Where Phase II cities overlap HQW or ORW water boundaries outside CAMA counties: Contact
 the <u>DWQ Regional Office</u> for a State Stormwater (SSW) permit. However, you must verify all local
 post-construction requirements are met. Even though the State Stormwater program currently
 satisfies Phase II, the local government may mandate more stringent controls.
- Where Tar-Pamlico NSW Strategy Areas overlap Coastal (CAMA) Counties: Please contact the <u>local government</u> in your area for NSW stormwater requirements. You must also contact the <u>DWQ</u>
 Regional Office for a SSW permit.
- Where Tar-Pamlico NSW Strategy Areas overlap HQW or ORW water boundaries: Please contact
 the <u>local government</u> in your area for NSW stormwater requirements. You must also contact the
 <u>DWQ Regional Office</u> for a SSW permit.
- Where Tar-Pamlico NSW Strategy Areas overlap WS-I, II, III, IV: Please contact the <u>local</u> government in your area for NSW stormwater requirements. You must also contact the local <u>Water</u> Supply Watershed Program jurisdiction to ensure WS requirements are met.
- Where Neuse NSW Strategy Areas overlap Coastal (CAMA) Counties: Please contact the <u>local</u> government in your area for NSW stormwater requirements. You must also contact the <u>DWQ</u>
 Regional Office for a SSW permit.
- Where Neuse NSW Strategy Areas overlap HQW or ORW water boundaries: Please contact the <u>local government</u> in your area for NSW stormwater requirements. You must also contact the <u>DWQ</u> Regional Office for a SSW permit.

Guidance for When Multiple Permits May be Required

- Where Neuse NSW Strategy Areas overlap WS-I, II, III, IV: Please contact the <u>local government</u> in your area for NSW stormwater requirements. You must also contact the local <u>Water Supply</u> <u>Watershed Program</u> jurisdiction to ensure WS requirements are met.
- Where Neuse/Tar-Pamlico NSW Strategy Areas overlap Water Supply and HQW/ORW boundaries:
 Please contact the local government in your area for NSW stormwater requirements. You must also contact the local <u>Water Supply Watershed Program</u> jurisdiction to ensure WS requirements are met. In addition, you must contact the <u>DWQ Regional Office</u> for a SSW permit.
- Where Phase II areas overlap Neuse, Tar-Pamlico, and portions of the Catawba River Basins: More stringent buffer requirements (than the 30 foot buffer required by Session Law 2006-246) apply in these areas per the applicable 15A NCAC 2B .0200 Rules.
- These existing programs satisfy Phase II Post-Construction, as of October 1, 2008:
 - ✓ Water Supply Watersheds I IV (15A NCAC 2B .0212 .0216)
 - ✓ Freshwater HQW (15A NCAC 2H .1006)
 - ✓ Freshwater ORW (15A NCAC 2H .1007)

 - ✓ Tar-Pam NSW Management Strategy (15A NCAC 2B .0258)
 - ✓ Randleman Lake Water Supply (15A NCAC 2B .0251).
