General Discussion from County staff notes: All household, white goods, processed wood or anything man made goes to the county landfill at a fee of \$40 per ton for disposal. Only leaf collection, limbs and small trees cut by homeowner and yard debris go to our municipal site.

Question # 51: Yard Waste Temporary Storage: Before being sent to the Martin County Landfill, organic yard wastes are sent the town's facility at 1801 Willow Drive in Williamston, NC (Williamston Waste Treatment Plant) where it is stored for chipping. From communications with the local Division of Waste Management staff, the town reports that there is no required permit for the yard waste due to the fact that it is stored at the facility until its chipped. The material is then sent on to the Martin County Landfill. (Historical Record of towns yard waste management discussions -DH).

Question # 51: Yard Waste Management for the last two fiscal years:

"Mr. Hance had sent me an email regarding question #51 and a couple of others as well.

The Town sent 209.21 tons of LCD to the Martin County Landfill for them to use as cover material.

He also had a question about the 3800 cubic yards which I explained was a combination of a total of LCD as well as totals from operations which did not need to be incorporated with LCD totals.

Mr. Hance spoke with Martin County Landfill and verified our tonnage and was supposed to correct his paperwork to reflect our conversation. That was per our last contact on August 28th. Feel free to call with any questions. Thank you.
